Dracaena draco, or dragon tree, is a very vulnerable plant found only in (endemic to) the arid, rocky mountain ranges of the Canary Islands, Madeira and the Azores. Although the dragon tree is now a common houseplant and garden specimen, there are very few naturally occurring individuals remaining in its narrow ecological range. *Dracaena draco* was regarded for centuries in European legends as "the blood of dragons," and was often used for its supposed magical and medicinal qualities. The resin is used today to produce incense and varnishes used to stain and polish wood, including that of Stradivarius violins.
